Our responsibility is to ensure they have the resources and environment they need to protect our community effectively.

We seek to raise between 1.5 and 2 million dollars to reconstruct the apparatus bays providing structural stability and update necessary equipment. A new, fully operational fire station will provide the necessary infrastructure to support our firefighters' training, readiness, and response capabilities.

I humbly ask for your support in this critical endeavor. Your contribution will make a profound difference in our firefighters' lives and our community's safety. Together, we can ensure that Fire Station 91 becomes a beacon of hope and security for all.
